Finishing one subject every four days – which he accomplished – means finishing seven subjects in one month. If Carlo continues with this output, he will be able to finish a full-college course, not in two years, but in five months.

Or, if he finishes one subject in a week – which is what he said he is trying to do, with enough time to review for each final exam – a college degree can be his in only nine months!

If he coasts along and finishes one subject every ten days – which was his original target – his college education can be finished in exactly one year.

NTC Approves Transfer of Radio Stations to COMNET

After a series of hearings that started in 2002, the National Telecommunications Commission (NTC) finally approved on November 28, 2007 the transfer of DYTR-AM and FM from Tagbilaran Broadcasting System (TBS) to the CAP Family's broadcasting arm, Community Media Network, Inc. (COMNET).

COMNET acquired DYTR-AM and FM in Tagbilaran City and DYCN in Roxas City in 1996. Since then, it has been operating these two stations. With the NTC's assent to COMNET's petition for the final approval of the Deed of Assignment, DYTR and DYCN are now officially registered under COMNET, not TBS.

Excerpts from the Certificate of Authority to CAP Life Insurance Corporation:
